JustRuns

JustRuns 4 WD Club, San Diego. No Meetings, No Officers, No Dues, No Politics.

JustRuns is an informal group of people who share a passion for 4 wheeling. They have a forum where members can plan and schedule 4 wheel drive trips over the internet as well as share 4 wheel drive related information and experiences. As the opening line suggests there are no officers, no meetings, no dues, and no politics, JustRuns. Anyone can join JustRuns. Anyone with the proper equipment can attend any of their events. Guests are always welcome and there is never a charge by either the run leader or the group for attending any runs.

They do practice safe, legal, and environmentally responsible 4 wheeling. Here is a partial list of their bullet points:

- We expect participants to behave responsibly and to consider the safety of themselves, their passengers, and others when participating with our group.
- It is the vehicle owner's responsibility to make sure the vehicle is in reliable and safe operating condition.
- The required equipment and trail difficulty rating is listed on their web site.
- Under no circumstances does this group condone illegal, foolhardy, or risky behavior on our runs.
- JustRuns does not condone drinking alcohol on the trail.
- We do our best to restrict travel to established trails and avoid "cross country" travel. We expect members to do their best to avoid damage to the environment.

JustRuns expects participants to obey all laws and regulations. Whenever another participant needs help on the trail they expect all other participants to do what ever they can to assist. If a vehicle breaks on the trail they NEVER leave them stranded without resources to reach help or safety.

If you ever break down or get stuck on the trail JustRuns has a list of volunteers to contact to help recover the vehicle and get you to safety.

They claim to be the most "Active" 4WD Club in the Nation averaging over 5 runs per month since 2002 and 7 runs per month in 2009.

I personally have participated in about half a dozen JustRuns events and have always had a fun and positive experience. All of their members I have met have been friendly, helpful, and have followed the listed rules.

I would encourage all 4 wheelers to visit their website at www.justruns.com and consider going on at least one of their runs. You may get hooked and join this fun group!

FRIENDS OF OCOTILLO WELLS

Friends of Ocotillo Wells started as a dream of our beloved Harold Soens. He had a dream to help Ocotillo Wells survive. Unfortunately he was unable to create that dream after being taken from us so early. I decided after speaking with Kathy Dolinar (the superintendent of the Ocotillo Wells SVRA) that the park really needed a non-profit to help. So off I went on my quest to help get Harold's dream off the paper and into reality.

I really didn't know what I was getting myself into. I did a lot of research of how to create a nonprofit 501(c)(3). I enlisted the help of a legal company on line called Legal Zoom. They walked me thru the steps and filed all the paperwork for me with the Secretary of State of California and Friends of Ocotillo Wells was on its way. I then filed all the paperwork with the IRS and after months and months of waiting Friends is now officially a 501(c)(3) corporation and is now able to accept members and receive donations from people and companies. Donations are tax deductible. The officers and board members consist of myself, Jan Chaney – Pres., John Donnellon (of JD Built) as Sec., Meg Grossglass as Treasurer, Jim Hurkman (from North County Yamaha), Steve Chaney (working on our grants), Carmen Lucas (Indian Affairs Rep) and Steve Quartieri (State Parks Representative).

Friends of Ocotillo Wells' mission is to help Ocotillo Wells SVRA with education and promotion of the State Park. We will be promoting desert cleanups and assisting the OW staff with projects. Once we really get going we hope to be able to get grants to help with the ATV training and other projects like possibly acquiring property to expand the park and eventually we will have a little gift shop in the resource center where we will be able to sell items to the public.

If you love your riding area, I encourage you to help any way you can. Here are a couple of different ways. First: Come out and volunteer. Since you are already out there you might as well be doing something to help. You can do volunteer patrols, archeological site stewardship, or the resource center. Second: Support. We need all the support we can get. We have memberships available from individual to family to business and even an adopting a wash program. We also have a donation box set up at the Ranger's Station. So next time you are in and you stop by to get that map or just information feel free to drop in some loose change from your pocket. Remember every penny counts when it comes to keeping your riding park open for you to enjoy.

Product Safety: CPSC Issues Proposal to Address Hazards of Recreational Off-Road Vehicles

The Consumer Product Safety Commission Oct. 22 approved an advanced notice of proposed rulemaking that addresses safety hazards of recreational off-highway vehicles.

The agency said the ANPR aims to address the dramatic increase in the use of ROVs—a relatively new product category—with a concomitant rise in associated deaths and injuries. ROVs are defined by the agency as motorized vehicles with four or more low-pressure tires that are made to be used as recreational vehicles.

Preliminary evaluations of ROVs indicated that the vehicles may exhibit inadequate lateral stability, undesirable steering characteristics, and inadequate occupant protection during a rollover crash, according to the CPSC.

CPSC staff said in a recent briefing packet that the industry's draft voluntary standard does not adequately address the hazards of ROVs and recommended rulemaking (196 DER A-21, 10/14/09).

The recommendation prompted swift reaction from a representative of the Recreational Off-Highway Vehicle Association (ROHVA), who called the decision "premature" and pointed to development of an American National Standards Institute (ANSI) standard for ROVs that is currently under way.

CPSC staff reviewed the ROHVA draft proposed American National Standard for Recreational Off-Highway Vehicles, ANSI/ROHVA 1-200X and found preliminarily that the proposed standard does not adequately address the deaths and injuries associated with ROV rollovers and collisions.

"The need for federal rulemaking on ROVs is the consequence of not having a voluntary standard that effectively safeguards consumers. I have reviewed numerous death and injury reports tied to ROVs and I believe CPSC can play a vital role in making them safer," said CPSC Chairman Inez Tenenbaum in a statement.

Used for Off-road Recreation

The vehicles are not regulated by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration since they are for

off-road use and are intended by the manufacturer primarily for recreational use by one or more persons. Unlike light-utility vehicles, ROVs attain speeds greater than 30 miles per hour and are configured differently from all-terrain vehicles.

The agency is seeking written comments from the public regarding the risks of injury associated with ROVs and ways in which these risks could be addressed. After publication of the ANPR, the public will have 60 days to submit comments.

During the rulemaking process, Tenenbaum urged riders and passengers of ROVs to wear helmets, use their seat belts, know the terrain, and never allow anyone under the age of 16 years to drive the vehicles.

SDORC is selling California Nonresident OHV Use permits. As required by the California State OHV Division, all vehicles operated off-highway on public lands in California are required to be (1) street-licensed or (2) registered as an off-highway vehicle (OHV). If you are visiting California from another state and your vehicle does not have a current registration from your home state, you must purchase a California Nonresident OHV Use Permit before you recreate on public lands. The 2010 Nonresident OHV Use Permits are now available for purchase. The permit fee is \$30. You can buy the permits online from SDORC. A portion of your purchase goes to SDORC to help us fight to keep public lands open for OHV recreation.
